

TSA Regulations:

3-1-1 for carry-on: 3 ounce bottle or less (by volume) ; 1 quart-sized, clear, plastic, zip-top bag; 1 bag per passenger placed in screening bin. One-quart bag per person limits the total liquid volume each traveler can bring. 3 oz. container size is a security measure.

Airline Regulations:

Carry-on: One (1) bag no more than 9 X 14 X 22 inches plus one (1) personal item—tote bag, purse, brief case, etc. If you have 2, one must fit under the seat.

Checked Bags: Two (2) pieces allowed—including instruments—per person (extra bags cost money). Bag weight limit is 50 pounds and 62 linear inches. Over weight and over size bags cost extra money; no bag weighing more than 100 pounds is accepted.

ID: A passport or other government-issued photo ID (national, state, or local) is required for travelers age 18 and over. If you do not have a photo ID, you can also use two forms of non-photo ID, one of which has to be issued by a state or federal agency. Travelers may be asked to show this ID at subsequent points, such as at the gate, along with their boarding passes. BRT recommends school photo ID for students under 18 or without a driver's license
